It's a Knockout-77

TWENTY-ONE British towns set out on the trail to international fame in *Jeux sans Frontières*. An estimated 240,000,000 people watch the show across Europe.

The first It's a Knockout was broadcast 'live' from Morecambe sands in 1966 and nearly ended in disaster. The tide came in during the closing minutes and cameramen were up to their knees in water by the end!

Three towns take part in each of the seven 'domestic' heats, with the winner from each programme representing Britain in the international series. This includes teams from France, Belgium, Germany, Italy, Holland and Switzerland.

The grand final, with the highest-scoring teams from each nation, will be staged at Ludwigsburg, in Germany, on September 7.

All seven successful British towns also participate in a special all-winners programme on neutral ground at Charnock Richard, near Preston, in Lancashire, for the Radio Times trophy. There will also be another all-star celebrity edition, and a Cup Final special with teams of supporters from the two clubs which win through to Wembley.

Teams from Beverley, Calderdale, and Wakefield met at Halifax on April 10 to begin the 1977 series. Round Two was scheduled to be staged at Oldham on April 17, with the home team taking on Wigan and Wirral, as was Round Three on April 24 in Mansfield, with Macclesfield and Wirksworth the visitors. The historic setting of Pembroke Castle was to be the venue for the Welsh heat, on May 1, with Cwmbran, Pembroke and Tenby as the contenders.

Today, May 8, Camberley's London Road Recreation Ground is the venue for the first Southern heat, with Basingstoke, home team Surrey Heath, and the Windsor and Maidenhead team.

A week after the Cup Final Special, Southend and Wandsworth meet with home team St Albans on May 22, and Crawley is host, on May 29, to Dartford and Maidstone in the final heat.

The winners of each of those contests compete for the title of British It's a Knockout Champion at Charnock Richard on June 19. Knockout's inimitable duo, Stuart Hall and Eddie Waring, are the commentators once again, and former international soccer referee Arthur Ellis continues as senior referee.

The Scoregirls

THEY'RE not just pretty faces; they also help the judges, and Eddie and Stuart, adjudicate and add up the scores. This year they are: Dinah May, currently Miss Great Britain, from Little Neston, Cheshire; Pam Nolan from Alkington, Middleton, Lancashire; and Brenda Lee from Oakwood, Leeds, Yorkshire.

Screen Personalities

STUART HALL

STUART HALL, who made his Knockout debut in 1972, presents Look North, the BBC North West weeknight TV magazine programme in Manchester and makes frequent appearances on the network in Nationwide.

He first broadcast in 1958 as a radio contributor in Sports Spotlight and has reported on soccer, cricket, tennis, motor racing and motor cycling, as well as current affairs.

His great loves are football, fast cars and antique clocks. Perhaps the clocks reign supreme – he loves their sense of continuity.

Married in 1958, Stuart has two teenage children, Francesca and Daniel. His home in Glossop, Derbyshire, is crammed with antique clocks, Victorian furniture, bronzes and old portraits. He sees Knockout as essentially a 'fun show' and is determined to make it as entertaining as possible for competitors and viewers.



EDDIE WARING

EDDIE, who joined the programme in 1966 and has vast experience of Knockout recordings all over Europe, has been a top BBC personality ever since TV came to the North in 1951, becoming a household name in covering Rugby League.

Born in Dewsbury, Yorkshire, Eddie played soccer, Rugby Union, Rugby League – and was a wrestler. A globe-trotter, he has made seven trips round the world and appeared on TV in Australia, New Zealand and the U.S.A.

Eddie usually gives a special blow-by-blow account of the mini-marathon, a contest which can be a vital tie-breaker in a tight contest. "For me," he says, "the programme really comes alive when we go into Europe. The atmosphere is electric, the competition intense, and yet so enjoyable. It's an exciting show to do."



ARTHUR ELLIS

ARTHUR ELLIS, from Halifax, one of the best-known soccer referees in the world, has officiated in practically every country where first-class football is played.

He refereed World Cup ties and 73 internationals in his time, and became the first English referee to be awarded the Gold Badge of FIFA. He now works as a brewery representative. Arthur is assisted by Mike Swann.



CECIL KORER

CECIL joined the series as producer last year, but he is by no means unfamiliar with the programme. He worked on the first two series in 1966 and 1967 as an assistant producer. Since then he's been involved with such shows as Children Talking as director, and produced such quizzes as Password and Ask the Family.

In recent years he has worked in London, but returned to the North—he was born in Stockport—in the autumn of 1975 to take over Knockout and develop other programme ideas from Leeds.

He has worked on the production team of such other long-running favourites as Top of the Pops and The Good Old Days.

Behind the Cameras

BEHIND the scenes there's a dedicated team that the Knockout live audiences see going about their complex duties, but it is a team discreetly out of sight of the TV audiences.

The director is Geoff Wilson, who makes sure that the producer's and engineers' efforts reach the screen in the way they were envisaged in the calm of the planning meetings.

Cecil Korer has the assistance of Alan Wright and Alan Walsh, who lead the full-time workers responsible for the months of advance preparation which go into the smooth running of the series.

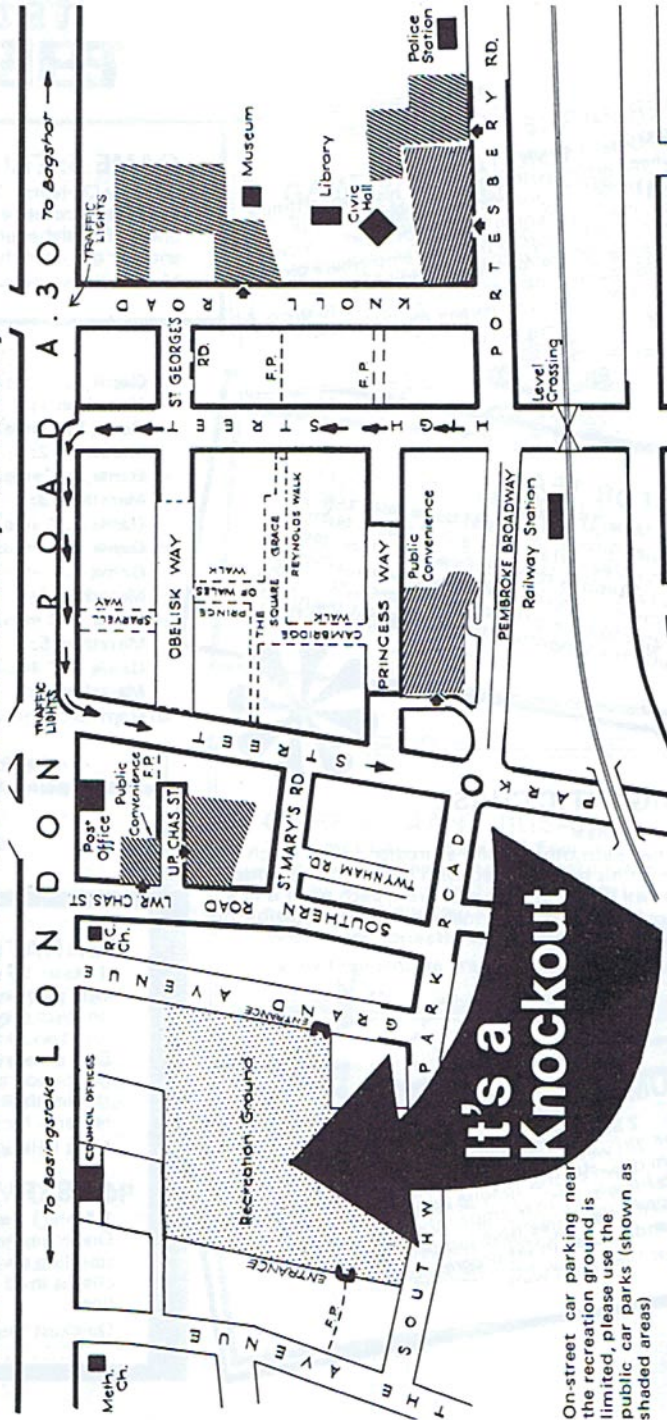
The games are devised by Paul Trerise, and designed by Mel Bibby and his assistant, Barry Roach.

Engineering manager Geoff Lomas ensures that all the complicated equipment functions correctly, and the stage managers, led by Bryan Chapman, can be seen racing backwards and forwards talking to the director's mobile control van, via 'walkie talkie' radio links during the course of the recording.

The Royal Military Academy Sandhurst Band Corps

THE Band of the Royal Military College — later the Royal Military Academy Sandhurst — has a unique history among British Army Bands.

Before the move to Sandhurst in 1813, the Band was stationed with the Royal Military College at Marlow in Buckinghamshire. At that time it consisted of a Bandmaster and 14 Bandsmen. Unlike all other Bands in the Army which were maintained by the officers of their regiment, the Royal Military College Band was paid by the War Office. It has the peculiar distinction of being recognised as a separate corps and therefore was, and still is, the smallest unit in the British Army.

During the nineteenth and twentieth centuries the corps grew in size. Today, Captain Brian Smith is the Director of Music and the Band consists of 38 musicians. They are well known not only for their performances on parade with the Royal Military Academy Sandhurst but also for their appearances at public events and concerts throughout England.

Various dance orchestral sections play not only for RMAS functions but for private parties, dances and stage concerts. Recently, a seventeen-piece dance orchestra successfully played a series of concerts featuring the music of Glenn Miller. In addition, the Band features a small string orchestra and a team of fanfare trumpeters.

A note of particular interest is that the first Bandmaster of whom there is any definite record was Thomas Sullivan whose son, Arthur, was to become perhaps the most popular and widely enjoyed of all British musicians. The old Sandhurst of the 1840s was the home of the child, Arthur, who from the age of three had the run of the basement where the Band practised. There he became acquainted with all the instruments of which his father had direction: a knowledge which served him exceptionally well in his later years as a composer.
