



# BBC tv IT'S A KNOCK OUTS

Cambridge meets its old adversaries Oxford and Peterborough to fight it out in a gamut of games which will decide who goes forward to compete for international honours in Europe.

Southport will be the neutral host for this home international of "Jeux Sans Frontieres" on 12th August, 1975, where the British winners will take on some of their Continental rivals before going on to the finals in Belgium.

This year's teams have been selected from more than 100 towns throughout Britain, from the Isle of Man to Cornwall, St. Ives being the first heat on the 6th April, and our own heat being the last, so that by the time you read this programme we shall know who the winners are to meet in the next round.


The games are a mixture of water obstacles, comedy relays, spectacular contraptions, crazy ball games, and the mini-marathon of Fil Rouge (red thread) as the Europeans call it. For the international contest the rule is that the games are a closely-guarded secret until the day of the event.

Who thinks them up? Throughout the winter months, producer Barney Colehan and designer Stuart Furber have been sifting through ideas sent in by viewers, suggestions from other countries, and of course, some of their own. If Stuart has a pre-occupied look today it's because he's responsible for the successful working of all those wonderful contraptions.

The BBC's "It's a Knockout" competition has become an established feature of the country's summer entertainment programme and is "compulsory" viewing for millions of people. Its success, and its continuing popularity with all age groups, is undoubtedly due to its content of imaginative, healthy competition combined with excitement and spectacle. The two university cities of Oxford and Cambridge are traditional rivals in many fields. "It's a Knockout" provides yet another. The inclusion of our near neighbour. Peterborough, makes it a more interesting, three-cornered affair. I'm sure this will give us an exciting and thrilling contest.

#### Cambridge

Although it is famous for its University, Cambridge began much earlier as a Roman camp overlooking the river ford (now Magdalene Bridge) and not far from the "Knockout" ground. The Romans were followed by invasions

of Saxons, Danes and Normans, who all added their bit to the town, which was now expanding where the present city centre lies. After all these invasions by armies, the people of Cambridge probably didn't realise the even greater effects that would result when they accepted some scholars who had had to flee from Oxford after trouble with Oxford residents. Within a few years, a University was being established in Cambridge. Since that time the University has become the great attraction of the city, with an array of courts and fine buildings, lawns sweeping down to the river, and a succession of attractive college bridges. Most of the older colleges lie in a group between the river and the city centre, and visitors may walk through them, and take in at the same time one or two of the old city churches such as St, Bene't's and the Round Church.

Before and after the College Backs, the river passes the city's commons and open spaces, suitable for picnics and games. Here punts and rowing boats can be hired, and there are swimming pools, tennis courts, a bowling green and a putting green.






Barney Colehan Producer




Arthur Ellis Referee


Mike Swann, who joins Arthur on the whistle, is from Banbury and is a former "Knockout" team captain and coach, and a fanatical supporter of the series.

#### **Christopher Heron**







1 heat of 3 teams 3 males, 2 females


The object of the game is for the girls to balance on the ball whilst the men push the ball along the course. The winning team will be the one that is able to get both girls to the end of the course in the shortest time.




# 3 SHIELD RACE



1 heat of 3 teams 3 males, 1 female






# 6 SWINGING LETTERS


# 7 TO THE RESCUE



Although his main interests were basketball and football, it was in athletics that he eventually represented England's schools in the Schools International against Wales, Scotland and Northern Ireland. Roger went on to become the southern counties 440 vds. youth champion. He joined the police service in 1966 and after a short break continued with his sporting activities, playing football for Oxford City Police and taking part in other events. However, it was once again in athletics that he made his major contribution, representing the British Police in the European Police Athletics Championships and becoming the British Police 100 and 200 metres champion. Roger and his team look forward with relish to taking on their traditional rivals, Cambridge, with the added incentive that they must also beat Peterborough to get through to the next round.

#### Nicola Sparkes (19) Oxford's Girl Captain

Nicola is proud to be the joint captain of the Oxford team, particularly as they are competing against Cambridge, extending a rivalry to the towns which has existed between the Universities for many years. Educated at Burford Grammar School and presently engaged in a years teaching practice at a local school: she will shortly be entering Lady Mabel College, Rotherham to read English and Physical Education. At school, Nicola, participated in all sports and represented the school in most of them. Although she played hockey she found that the conflict in technique between this and her first love Golf led her to concentrate on the latter with more than a little success, including the 1972 Berks, Bucks and Oxon Junior Championship and in 1973 becoming the youngest Oxford Ladies Champion at 17. In the following year she was ninth in the Amateur Women's under 23 Competition which qualified her for the British Match Play and Stroke Play Tournaments, ultimately reaching the last eight of the Wills International Tournament in 1974. With her male colleague Roger Herbert, Nicola looks forward to leading the Oxford team in friendly rivalry with Cambridge and Peterborough.






