



"THE ADVENTURES OF ALICE"

THE AUTHOR

Charles Lutwidge Dodgson (1832 - 1898) is known throughout the world by his pseudonym Lewis Carroll. Educated at Rugby public school, then at Christ Church, Oxford he became a lecturer in mathematics at the same college. It was at Oxford that he became a good friend of Henry George Liddell, the Dean of Christ Church. It was Alice, Liddell's young daughter who was Carroll's inspiration for the main character of his two masterpieces - "Alice's Adventures in Wonderland" and "Through the Looking Glass".

THE ILLUSTRATOR

Sir John Tenniel (1820 - 1914) was already celebrated as a cartoonist for "Punch", England, s leading satirical magazine, when approached by Carroll in 1864 to illustrate "Alice's adventures in Wonderland". No edition of either of the novels can be complete without these original illustrations.

THE PROGRAMME AND THE GAMES

The Liddell family spent their summer holidays at Llandudno, not far from Bodelwyddan. Dodgson (Carroll) often visited the family there. That is why we chose this theme. We have based our eight games on characters and situations taken from "Alice in Wonderland" and "Alice Through the Looking Glass". The costume designs are based on Sir John Tenniel's original illustrations. Our presenters Nia Chiswell and Iestyn Garlick will be dressed as Alice and The Mad Hatter, and the competitors as characters which appear in the two novels which completely changed children's literature here.

The set is based on the two novels - one half representing the wonderland, the other the world of the chess board.

GAME 1 "THE WHITE KNIGHT" ("THROUGH THE LOOKING GLASS")

It is the kind white knight who shows Alice how to reach the last square of the chess board so that she herself can also be crowned queen. He rescues her from the red knight, and leads her through the wood and over the brook. He is also an inventor of mad little devices e.g. anklets on his horse's feet to guard against shark bites. He is "certainly not a good rider", and "whenever the horse stopped (which it did very often), he fell off in front; and whenever it went on again (which it generally did rather suddenly), he fell off backward......"

GAME 2 "THE QUEEN'S CASTLE" ("THROUGH THE LOOKING GLASS")

As the world is a chess board in "Through the Looking Glass", we decided to base a game on building a castle for the queen chess piece. The castles are hidden inside one another like a Russian doll.

GAME 3 "THE GARDENERS AND THE ROSES" ("THROUGH THE LOOKING GLASS")

In "Through the Looking Glass" Alice comes across a large rose tree near the entrance to the garden, and three painters called Two, Five, and Seven. They are painting the white roses red. When asked why they reply "why the fact is, you see, Miss, this here ought to have been a red rose tree, and we put a white one in by mistake; and if the Queen was to find out, we should all have our heads cut off".

The adversary is dressed as a rocking-horse fly which is a characater amongst the talking insects in the novel.

GAME 4 "HUMPTY DUMPTY" ("THROUGH THE LOOKING GLASS")

One of Carroll's most well-known characters is Humpty Dumpty who is the main character in a very well known nursery rhyme "Humpty Dumpty sat on the wall....."

Humpty Dumpty is in fact a very snobbish egg.

In our game Humpty Dumpty falls off a spoon and climbs up to sit on a wall. It is Humpty Dumpty who explains the poem "Jabberworcky" to Alice. She says of him "of all the unsatisfactory people I ever met".

GAME 5 "THE TEA PARTY" ("ADVENTURES IN WONDERLAND")

After having found a way on entering the garden (Wonderland) Alice is passed several times by the mad March hare who is constantly looking at his watch. The Cheshire Cat points her in the direction of the mad hatters house. When she arrives there is a table set out under a tree in front of the house where the hare and the hatter are having a tea. A dormouse is sitting between them, fast asleep. It is always half past four in the mad hatters world and that is why the mad March hare is forever looking at his watch, and why there are so many places set for tea - because it is always teatime and so they simply move around the table rather than re-setting it constantly.

To cut a long story short, the mad March hare and the mad hatter push the poor dormouse into a teapot. In this game they are passing teabags to the dormouse so that he can climb out of the teapot.

GAME 6 "THE LION AND THE UNICORN" ("THROUGH THE LOOKING GLASS")

The lion and the unicorn are fighting for the crown and as the king himself says "and the best of the joke is, that it's my crown all the while". Another part of the novel is again based on an old song "The Lion and the Unicorn were fighting for the crown."

Of course the unicorn refers to Alice as "a fabulous monster", as he has never seen a child before. Neither of them ever win in the novel, and so in our game they are working together to get as many crowns as possible.

GAME 7 "THE CROQUET GAME" ("ADVENTURES IN WONDERLAND")


In Alice's Adventures in Wonderland, Alice is visited by the Queen Of Hearts to join in a game of croquet. Alice had "never seen such a curious croquet ground in all her life..... the balls were live hedgehogs, the mallets live flamingos, and the soldiers had to double themselves up and to stand on thier hands and feet to make the arches".


The Cheshire cat's face appears in the air during the course of the game and speaks to Alice.

GAME 8 "TWEEDLEDUM AND TWEEDLEDEE" ("THROUGH THE LOOKING GLASS")

"They were standing under a tree, each with an arm round the other's neck, and Alice knew which was which in a moment, because one of them had "Dum" embroidered on his collar and the other "Dee". I suppose they've each got "Tweedle round at the back of the collar" she said to herself.

They are both fat, little men, like a couple of great schoolboys. They tell her the poem "The Warus and the Carpenter".





PROGRAMME 2

"THE ZODIAC"

Most people have at sometime or another read the popular "star sign" columns in the newspapers and magazines. This sun sign astrology simply divides the population up into 12 basic personality types. The sun is only one of ten planets in anyone's horoscope chart.

The word "horoscopes" is Greek for "I watch that which is rising".

In our programme we are merly taking the basic 12 sun signs which form the basic "clock" relating to the journey of the sun through the heavens.

We have four games based on opposing signs of the zodiac and four on individual signs.

GAME 1 ARIES AND LIBRA

A game based on the opposing signs of Aries and Libra.

ARIES

The Myth

The ram (according to mythology) who was a supernatural being, sent by Zeus to rescue Phirxus and Helle from their wicked stepmother. Helle fell from the ram's back and was drowned in the sea, but Phirxus arrived safely and sacrificed the beast to Zeus who placed its form in the heavens. The ram's fleece turned to gold and was hung in sacred grove. This was later found and captured by Jason during his battles with the Argonatus.

Traits

Said to be good metalworkers, good engineers, butchers and dentists. Their hobbies include metalwork, hand-gliding and car maintenance.

LIBRA

The Myth

Libra represents the scales who according to the Babylonians was the god Zibanitu who sat deciding on the judgement of the dead and living souls.

The Greeks believed it to be associated with Athene who held courts of justice amongst mortals.

Traits

They make good barristers, judges and diplomats. Sunbathing, cooking and flower arranging are some of their hobbies.

In this game the LIbrans, the barristers are being helped by Aries, the good engineers to move their large legal books and portfolios.

GAME 2 TAURUS AND SCORPIO

TAURUS

The Myth

The Bull. Zeus apparently disguised himself as a white bull to seduce Europa. They had three sons, and their births were commerorated by Zeus who placed a form of a bull among the stars.

Traits

They make good accountants, jewellers, models and sculptors, and among their hobbies are wrestling, pottery, and ballroom dancing.

SCORPIO

The Myth

Represents the Scorpion called upon by Hera from the underworld to destroy Orion. He halted horses pulling the god's sun chariot after it had been taken on a joyride by Phaidon, Apollo's son.

Traits

They make good policemen, psychologists and undertakers and among their hobbies are seduction, sex, scuba diving and investigating mysteries.

Here we have a game with Taurus, the ballroom dancer and Scorpio the seducer.

GAME 3"LEO AND AQUARIUS"

LEO

The Myth

The constellation signifies the Nemean Lion which was sent by Hera to test her arch enemy Hercules in the first of his twelve Labours. Hercules slays the lion and cloaked himself in the lion's skin to help protect himself against future enemies.

Traits

Leo people apparently are good hairdressers, sportsmen, chairmen and charity organisers. They enjoy giving parties, opera and showjumping.

AQUARIANS

The Myth

There are many myths associated with the sign of Aquarius, including that of the god Hapi from whose jars poured the river Nile according to the Egyptians.

Traits

Aquarians make good archaeologists, pilots, inventors and writers and enjoy flying, UFOlogy and collecting gadgets.

This game involves Leo the showjumping lion and Aquarius the water carrier.

GAME 4 SAGGITARIUS

The Myth

The star sign Saggitarius signifies the centaur, Chiron - a half man, half horse creature born out of the union of Philyra and the God Cronos. When discovered in flagrante, Cronos turned himself into Chiron and rode away. He became a healer famed for his wisdom and righteousness. He taught the gods in music and taught Archilles to hunt.

Traits

Saggitarrians make good horse trainers, jockeys, priests, vets and travel agents and enjoy all sports, horse racing, practical jokes and gambling.

In our game Chiron is showing his skills on the hunting bow, aided by Archilles, his pupil.

GAME 5 GEMINI

The Myth

The sun sign Gemini is associated with the twins Castor and Pollux. They were the children of Leda and Zeus. Castor was killed in a fight and Pollux grieved until he was restored to life by their father Zeus. To repay Zeus for his generosity they were forced to live alternate days in Hades and Olympus.

Traits

Gemini people make very good chauffeurs, postmen and navigators and love gossiping, conjuring and telephoning.

Here the twins, Castor and Pollux are travelling up from Hades to Olympus and back, collecting pieces of a jigsaw to form a picture of themselves together.

GAME 6 CAPRICORN

The Myth

The sun sign Capricorn signifies the fish tailed Goat, Amalthaeia, who looked after the child Zeus while he was in hiding from his evil father, Cronos.

When Zeus became the chief of the gods he took one of the goat's horns which was to become the Cornucopia, the horn of plenty.

Traits

Capricorns make good antique dealers, musicians, politicians and architects and love jogging, collecting and rock climbing.

Here, Capricorns, the sign of the achiever climb the wall to reach the top in their domain.

GAME 7 CANCER

The Myth

The sun sign of Cancer immortalizes the crab sent by Hera against her old enemy Hercules. The crab was sent to fight against Hercules in the second of his twelve labours - the destruction of the nine-headed serpent, Hydra - but only succeeded in wipping his ankles. Cancer was crushed underfoot, but was raised to the heavens by Hera.

Traits

People born under the sign of Cancer make good fishermen, nurses, sailors and hoteliers and enjoy DIY, sailing and water-skiing.

Here, they must use their skiing skills to nip the heel of Hercules.

GAME 8 VIRGO AND PISCES

The Myth

Virgo refers to the myth of the godess Astraea who was sent by their father Zeus to earth to teach mortals to obey the laws of nature. All went well for a time, but eventually she returned to live among the gods, disappointed by mankind.

Traits

Virgo people make good craftsmen, dentists, doctors, nurses and enjoy ballet, model making, pastry cooking and writing.

PISCES

The Myth


Commemorates the fish who rescued Aphrodite and her son Eros from the river when they tried to escape the giant Typhon. The fish were tied together by their tails and raised to the heavens as reward.

Traits

Pisces people make good fishmongers, prison workers, photographers and sailors and apparently love the cinema, drinking, photography, dreaming and luckily swimming.

Here, the Pisces who love swimming rescue the goddess Astraea, virgo. Virgos enjoy ballet, but can they balance on the shell boats?



Roedd angen 9 llwyth lori artic o sgaffold i godi'r llwyfan. We required 9 articulated lorry loads of scaffolding for the staging.

Mae dros 1,000 darn o ply 8' x4' ar y llwyfan. It took over 1,000 8' x4' ply wood to construct the stage.

Mae angen 1,000 k.w. i oleuo'r set. h.y. dros 500 o lampau. It requires 1,000 kw to light the set - over 500 lamps.

Crewyd y gemau tua mis Tachwedd y llynedd. The games were created in November last year.

Ar of 10 wythnos o gynllunio, dechreuwyd ar y gwaith adeiladu ar Fawrth 1 af. After 10 weeks of planning, construction commenced on March 1st.

Darlledir y rhaglen i dros 30 miliwn o bobl ledled Ewrop ac i'r gwledydd sy'n siarad Portiwgaeg yn Asia, Africa a De America.

The programme is televised to over 20 million people across Europe and Portugese speaking countries in Asia, Africa and South America.

Mae'r twr goleuo ucha'n 60 troedfedd. The highest lighting tower is 60 feet.

Ar gyfer y 10 diwrnod ola' - prysura' - ym Modelwyddan roedd angen lletya dros 300 o bobl (3,000 o welyau o fusnes!)

During the last ten days - the busiest - we required accommodation for 300 people.

Gwnaethpwyd y gemau a'r dillad yng Nghaernarfon, Wrecsam a Bryste. The games and costumes were made in Caernarfon, Wrexham and Bristol.

Mae rhai o oleuadau'r "Zodiac" yn rhan o oleuadau enwog Blackpool. Some of the 'Zodiac' lights are from the famous Blackpool illuminations.

Mae'r pyllau dwr/nofio yn dal 145,000 galwyn. The swimming pools contain 145,000 gallons of water.

Roedd angen 2 lori x 40 troedfedd i ddod a'r props o Fryste. It took two 40ft lorries to bring the props from Bristiol.

Mae 3,000 o beli yn creu niwsans i Hympti Dympti. It takes 3,000 balls to create a nuisance for Humpty Dumpty.

3,00 libes o baent. 5,000 o gwpanau plastic. The set took 3,000 litres of paint and over 5,000 plastic cups.
